COVID-19 GUIDELINES AND MANDATES

These guidelines and mandates are developed in accordance with state, and local regulations and are subject to change.

Access: The following individuals are not allowed to enter the competition grounds.

Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms. Symptoms include, but are not limited to, subjective or measured fever, cough, shortness of breath/or difficulty breathing. Additional symptoms include sore throat, muscle pain, headache, chills/shaking, or newly developed loss of taste or smell.

Anyone who has tested positive for COVID 19 within the last 10 days.

Anyone who has tested positive outside of the past 10 days, but is still symptomatic.

Anyone who has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 14 days.

Attendance will not be open to the general public, but friends and family of participants will be allowed to attend in addition to participants. Participants include essential staff, volunteers, and service providers; judges, trainers, exhibitors/riders, groomers, and owners. The show will not be open for public spectators.

- All participants must wear a face mask at all times while on the competition grounds when not mounted on a horse or seated in a driving cart.
- Social distancing is required. Continue to keep about 6 feet between yourself and others. The face mask is not a substitute for social distancing.
- Competition office will be restricted to essential personnel only. You are strongly encouraged to enter on-line at www.horshowsonline.com. Entries may also be mailed, emailed or faxed.
- Only one representative from a barn will be allowed to transact business with the show secretaries. Only two barn representatives will be allowed in the competition office at a time. The designated representative will be responsible for check in and out for their customers. Invoices can be emailed by request. Forms for adds/scratches will be available in the competition office or adds/scratches can be on-line at www.horseshowsonline.com. No adds/scratches will be accepted via text or phone.

- Only two people per entry will be allowed in the warm-up areas.
- Seating will be limited in the coliseum to allow for social distancing.
- Trainers will be held responsible for the conduct and adherence to these guidelines for all individuals in their barn, including their staff and customers. Competition management reserves the right to require a barn or anyone to leave the competition grounds for failure to follow guidelines.
- **Follow these tips to help prevent COVID-19:**
 - Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing; going to the bathroom; and before eating or preparing food. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
 - Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
 - Avoid close contact with people who are sick with respiratory symptoms.
 - Stay home when you are sick.
 - Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
 - Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

We are all in this together and the situation requires that each and every one of us takes personal responsibility for the health, safety and welfare of ourselves and others. Please follow these guidelines and take precautionary measures as you interact with one another.
